Summary of changes

A summary of the changes made to the Water Sharing Plan for the Peel Regulated River Water Source 2022

The Water Sharing Plan for the Peel Regulated, Unregulated, Alluvium and Fractured Rock Water Sources 2010 was updated as part of the Namoi Surface Water Resource Plan submitted to the Murray Darling Basin Authority in June 2020. The Water Sharing Plan for the Peel Valley Regulated, Unregulated, Alluvial and Fractured Rock Water Sources 2010 was due to expire on 30 June 2020. The plan was amended and extended for a further two-year period to 1 July 2022 to allow for the Department to respond to the NRC review and to meet the requirements of the Basin Plan.

As part of the amendments to the *Water Sharing Plan for the Peel Regulated, Unregulated, Alluvium and Fractured Rock Water Sources 2010* the water sources were moved to other plans to align with the Basin Plan:

- Water Sharing Plan for the Peel Regulated River Water Source 2010
- Water Sharing Plan for the Namoi and Peel Unregulated Rivers Water Sources 2012
- Water Sharing Plan for the Namoi Alluvial Groundwater Sources 2020, and
- Water Sharing Plan for the NSW Murray Darling Basin Fractured Rock Groundwater Sources 2020.

NSW is currently working with the Commonwealth to progress accreditation of NSW water resource plans. It is important that all state legislative instruments that form part of an accredited water resource plan are commenced prior to the accreditation of the water resource plan to avoid any potential inconstancy between the accredited water resource plan and the state legislation. As such, NSW has been progressing the replacement or amendment of NSW water sharing plans submitted as part of the water resource plans. All groundwater and unregulated river water sharing plans within the Murray Darling Basin were replaced or amended on 1 July 2020. A similar process is now being undertaken for regulated river water sharing plans within the Basin.

As part of the accreditation process for water resource plans the Murray Darling Basin Authority has written to the NSW Minister for Lands and Water to advise on the outcomes of their accreditation assessment. This assessment has not identified any issues that would result in a change to the Peel regulated river water sharing plan as submitted for accreditation.

Before the Minister for Lands and Water can replace or amend a water sharing plan under the provisions of the *Water Management Act 2000*, the concurrence of the Minister for the Environment and Heritage is required. Also, consistent with sections 9(1) and (5(3) of the Act, the Ministers must 'take all reasonable steps to do so in accordance with, and so as to promote, the water management principles of this Act', and in relation to water sharing observe the following priority order:

a) sharing of water from a water source must protect the water source and its dependent ecosystems, and

- b) sharing of water from a water source must protect basic landholder rights, and
- c) sharing or extraction of water under any other right must not prejudice the principles set out in paragraphs (a) and (b).

DPE Water worked with its colleagues at DPE Environment Energy and Science prior to its submission for concurrence and approval by the Ministers.

The table below outlines the substantive changes from the previous 2010 plan as a result of both the Basin Plan accreditation process and approval of the 2022 replacement plan under the *Water Management Act 2000*. Note also that the plan has been updated to simplify and modernise its drafting, improve clarity the intent of the provision and to provide a legally robust plan. Work is ongoing to respond to recommendation made in the NRC review of the plan and further amendments may be likely to the plan to incorporate these recommendations in the future.
