WHAT'S HAPPENING IN MARCH

- We are progressing with geotechnical investigations at the potential rock quarry and clay borrow sites around Wyangala.
- Preparation is underway for autumn field surveys for native animals and plants including the Golden Sun Moth, Striped Legless Lizard and Keys Matchstick Grasshopper as well as other species.
- We are continuing consultation with Registered Aboriginal Parties on the Project's draft Aboriginal Cultural Heritage Assessment Report.
- Meetings with key stakeholders are ongoing.
